Construction workers use a myriad of items in order to ply their trade. The storage area where these items are kept needs to be arranged in a safe and orderly fashion, otherwise two problems arise:

- 1. Improperly stacked items can fall and cause severe injury to the head, face and feet. Imagine the boxes and conduit in Figure 1 falling on you while retrieving an item below; or the box in Figure 2. There is also a trip hazard present in Figure 3, where a worker can slip on those clamps shown on the concrete floor.
- 2. Difficulty in finding supplies; the previous pictures also show how difficult it would be to quickly find, much less retrieve, work supplies. Figure 4, with all items lined up and segregated, finding and retrieving supplies is a simple, quick, and safe task.
